- An original essay of 750-1,000 words, typed and <u>double-spaced</u>, on the following topic: "Many young people today are replying, "none," when asked their religious preference. How does one develop a moral compass without religion or dogma?"
- 2. A one paragraph autobiography including interests, activities, college, and goals
- 3. High school transcript showing GPA of 3.0 or higher
- 4. Copy of student's driver's license or state-issued photo ID to verify Oregon or Washington residence

5. Completed application with parent or guardian's signed permission for student to enter the contest, to have winning essay published, and to present his or her essay at a meeting of the Humanists of Greater Portland
